In our scholars' words

Dear Donors

My name is Caley. I am a first year, First Generation Scholarship student at Manchester Metropolitan University studying Human Biosciences. My scholarship was funded by your donations. So, on behalf of all of my fellow First Generation Scholars, I wanted to write and thank you.

When I was invited to compose this letter, I looked in the dictionary to find out the exact meaning of the word 'philanthropy' – it is "the desire to promote the welfare of others, expressed especially by the generous donation of money to good causes" – I'd like to tell you my story of how philanthropy and your goodwill has changed my life.

It starts with being brought up in a working-class family. At 16, I had to go out, get a job and pay rent to provide a much-needed income for my family. A-levels were never on the cards for me. But two years ago, aged 33 and with a daughter, I started my journey. It took a global pandemic to give me the courage to make the first move in changing my career. I made the brave step of emptying my savings and started studying home A-levels alongside a Medical Science Diploma.

The next step was to choose a university, so I attended a Manchester Met Open Day. It was during the Open Day that I met with the First Generation Scholarship Ambassadors. They tried to tell me I was a scholarship candidate, but I would not believe them. Opportunities like this do not happen to people like me. I went home that day and put Manchester Met as my first choice on the UCAS form. My partner encouraged me to apply for the Scholarship too, even though I thought it would waste everyone's time. I thought I'd be lucky to secure a place at university, let alone a scholarship! Two weeks later, I received an email saying I had been chosen for a First Generation Scholarship. Me, a mature student from a council estate. It blew me away. The Scholarship Programme undoubtedly enriches the lives of students. My scholarship has given me the tools I need to develop transferable skills and has equipped me with the knowledge to achieve first class marks. My experience has also influenced my own family. My 13 year old daughter has already chosen her subject options to reflect her long term plan of going to university. A few years ago, that was never an option for her. You have helped create a domino effect, changing the dynamic of my family for generations.

I want to express my immense gratitude and appreciation. I would not be where I am today without your generosity. Your support is vital to students like me who need these life changing opportunities to succeed in gaining not just a degree, but the skills that enable us to reach our full potential – you have given me this through my scholarship at Manchester Met.

In the simplest expression there is, from all of the First Generation Scholars – a very heartfelt thank you.
