Terminology

Citation

Citations are in-text indicators of the source of information. All citations should have a corresponding entry in your reference list.

Reference list

The full details of all the sources you have cited in your work, listed at the end of your assignment, in alphabetical order.

Presenting citations

APA 7th style uses an author-date format. If you do not use the author's name in your writing, the author and year are placed in brackets at the end of the statement, as follows:

Recording personal achievements can be used as a reflective tool and can help an individual identify their own skills and expertise (Cottrell, 2015).

If you are using the author's name in your writing, you would add the year in brackets following the surname, as shown below:

Cottrell (2015) suggests that recording personal achievements can be used as a reflective tool and can help an individual identify their own skills and expertise.

Formatting citations

All citations will include the author's surname and the year of publication. When directly quoting, page numbers must also be included e.g. (Cottrell, 2015, p.25).

Additionally:

Missing element	What to do	Citation example
Author	Use the source title.	(Source Title, 2020)
Date	Write "n.d." for "no date".	(Smith, n.d.)
Page number	Either use an alternative locator or	(Smith, 2020, Chapter 3)
	omit the page number.	or
		(Smith, 2020)

Although page numbers are not required when paraphrasing or summarising, sometimes it can also be helpful to provide the page number(s) in these citations, as this can help the reader easily find the part of the source that you are referring to. Ask your tutor for further clarification.
