

YOUR DEGREE

Where do I start?

Manchester Metropolitan operates two degree classification mechanisms for undergraduates. Your final degree classification is calculated using whichever method is most beneficial to you in terms of overall grade. Your Student Support Officer or the Advice Centre at The Union MMU can help you understand these regulations.

Most awards also provide an option for students who leave the course prior to completion the opportunity for an interim exit award depending on the number of credits passed.

In some cases a programme may have an approved variation from Manchester Metropolitan's regulations. Where this is the case, course-specific arrangements supersede these guidelines.

YOUR DEGREE

Method 1: This combines 25% of your weighted average from Level 5 with 75% of your weighted average from Level 6 to create an overall average.

<u>Overall Average</u>	<u>Classification</u>
70-100%	1st
60-69%	2.1
50-59%	2.2
40-49%	3rd

Method 2: Only utilises marks from Level 6, with classification awarded based on these requirements:

<u>Results</u>	<u>Classification</u>
70% or higher in at least 60 credits and a minimum Level 6 average of 68%.	1st
60% or higher in at least 60 credits and a minimum Level 6 average of 58%.	2.1
50% or higher in at least 60 credits and a minimum Level 6 average of 48%.	2.2
120 credits with a minimum Level 6 average of 40% or higher.	3rd

Students not qualifying for a Bachelor's (Honours) degree may still earn a Pass degree if they have passed 60 credits or more at Level 6 having exhausted all reassessment opportunities. Pass degrees are not awarded with a classification (e.g. 1st, 2.1, etc.)

Condonement

Except where a course is Pass/Fail, the pass mark for all assessments is 40%. In some cases, students on Level 3 or Level 4 may qualify for Condonement in a unit if they achieve a marginal fail (35-39%). The unit will be recorded as having been passed without opportunity for reassessment. A maximum of 30 credits may be condoned.
