Fiona Benson: Still Life With Red Herrings

Fiona Benson's poems have been published in a wide range of journals, including The LRB, Poetry Review and The TLS. She won an Eric Gregory Award in 2006 and a Faber New Poets Award in 2009. She has a pamphlet of six Devon-inspired poems commissioned by Wordquest Devon and Cyprus Well. Her portfolio for the MMU poetry competition is part of a sequence of poems she is developing that takes the work of Vincent Van Gogh as its stepping-off point.
